The Feather Awards is an event to honour public figures who have captivated, inspired and empowered LGBTQIA+ people. The awards have become part of the fibre of the entertainment calendar. The awards use entertainment to highlight the challenges and issues faced by the LGBTI community. The awards recognise LGBTQIA+ people, entertainers and other public figures for their different contributions towards the community.

In November 2022 the awards celebrated their 14th year anniversary. The ceremony is presented as a theatre production, with audio visual presentations and musical entertainment provided by leading South African performers. The Feather Awards run numerous community outreach initiatives throughout the year to help educate, inform and support LGBTQIA+ communities nationally.

The LGBTQIA+ Dialogues are a national tour under the Feather Awards banner. Their main focus is to ao into predominantly black communities to educate and discuss issues around the LGBTQIA+ community. The dialogues are about collecting data from people on the ground around issues of sexuality. The dialogues present a unique opportunity for stakeholders and service providers to hear voices and experiences LGBTQIA+ youth of and thus get first-hand knowledge on what needs to be done to better their lives.





The Feathers Festival is a celebration of diversity and inclusivity, raising awareness about everything LGBTQIA+. The event is designed to provide a safe space for members of the community to come together, celebrate their unique identities and stories with everyone. It's an event which puts South Africa on the map profiling its cultural, political and leadership in the arena of LGBTQIA+ rights and Human Rights. Feathers Festival enjoyed the huge, positive media coverage in the Gauteng province, nationally and even internationally in its inaugural year, 2019, prior to the Covid 19 pandemic. The festival uses the creative arts to provide an accessible, friendly platform for a broader audience to gain awareness of everything LGBTQIA+ and contributes to educating society on homophobia and gender-based and intimate partner violence and other social ills in South Africa. Through the platform to we're able to extend a year-long calendar of outreach projects through the Thami Dish Foundation. As we continue the journey, we invite all who believe in diversity and inclusion, education, raising awareness, providing a safe space, and those who are brave enough to raise the LGBTQIA+ flag up high.

LAWENFORCEMENT AGENCIES SENSITISATION TRAININGS

The Thami Dish Foundation in partnership with the Department of community safety coordinate and facilitate LGBTQIA+ sensitization training for Law Enforcement Agencies. The trainings target all Social Crime coordinator, Prevention **FCS** officials, and CPF cluster chairpersons. The purpose of the trainings is to provide guidance to the South African Police Service (SAPS) members to treat the LGBTQIA+ persons who are victims with dignity and respect as stipulated in the Constitution of Republic South Africa.


